### What is a Caucus?

A Caucus is a gathering of neighborhoods — or precincts— for an election that is held every two years. This year it is March 8, 2022.

#### What is a Precinct Committeeman?

Some call it the most powerful office in the world, because it is the only office where a registered voter not only choose the candidates, but gets to determine their policy. It's the only way to change your party and your country neighborhood by neighborhood. And it doesn't cost you a dime — only your time and talent.

# What would be my job as Precinct's Chair or Vice-Chair?

It is your job to organize and direct the affairs of the precinct. You report to the Regional Chair. And you assist with — and are a voting member of — the County Central Committee. You will be asked to attend 4 meetings a year where you will help the Executive Board with campaigns, outreach, and recruitment.

The **Vice -Chair** is also a full voting member of the County Central Committee and takes over all responsibilities in the absence of the Chair.

## What would be my job as Precinct's State Delegate/State Alternate?

A state delegate, you represent your precinct by voting at the State's Nominating Convention (in the Spring of 2022) when you choose your party's nominees for Federal, and State offices.

You also vote for national committeemen and delegates to the Republican National Convention.

The **State Alternate** assumes these voting duties in the absence of the State Delegate.

### What would be my job as Precinct's County Delegate/County Alternate?

As County Delegate, you attend and vote at the County's Nominating Convention (in the Spring of 2022) where you choose the Summit County Council candidates, and other county offices, like Sheriff, Clerk, Attorney and Auditor.

You also vote at the County's Organizing Convention in the Spring of 2023 where you choose the County's new Executive Board and State Central Committee Member.

The **County Alternate** assumes these voting duties in the absence of the County Delegate.
